Teaching American History

For each of three years, thirty Montana teachers of American History will have the opportunity to participate in activities and training that enhance the teaching of U.S. History in schools. A three-year grant was awarded to the Southeast Education Service Center, Price, Utah by the U.S. Department of Education. Districts in the States of Montana and Washington are also involved in the project. Focusing on increasing teacher content knowledge of U.S. History, the project will be implemented in partnership with University History Departments from across the United States. Featured are the most knowledgeable professors of American History in the Country. Their expertise and content presentations will come from the unifying themes and narrative of human experience from the National Council for History Education. Methods to develop historical habits of mind will be emphasized. In addition, teachers will be able to adapt the curriculum to meet their state standards and promote student interest in American History.

Selected teachers will:

- Opportunity to participate in on-line content courses
- Attend a 3 day U.S. History Workshop in Montana each summer
- Increase content knowledge in selected U.S. History topics
- Have access to special U.S. History resources
